Annual Report – Digital Repositories Steering Committee 2024-2025 Academic Year

Here are some highlights from the work completed by the DRC this academic year.

- Discussed possible pilot project with the CSU Research Officers for a repository of successful CSU Grant Applications. After some deliberation and much discussion, the committee declined to move forward with the project due to staffing and time constraints.
- The Chancellor's Office migrated from Confluence to Sharepoint mid-year. While the transition was fairly quick, there are still reports and files that are tricky for users to find. Further work to migrate the reports and the recordings of past annual meetings to ScholarWorks is suggested.
- The Chair and the IRWG continues to work on and refine the Digital Library Repository Guide: https://dev.repositoryguide.calstate.edu/
- We revised the <u>DRC Charge</u> to make it accurate to our current situation.
- Decided that the 2025 Digital Repositories Meeting will be online again, due to fiscal constraints and budget cuts.
- Jennifer Beamer will chair the DRC for the 2025-2026 academic year.

Digital Archives Working Group Highlights:

During this fiscal year, DAWG has accomplished the following:

- Project Prioritization: Due to the two-year rotation of team members, maintaining
 project continuity and effective knowledge transfer has been an ongoing challenge.
 In response, the team identified remaining tasks and established priorities by
 mapping past, current, and future projects.
- Workform Completion: This effort involved reviewing each metadata element, clarifying value types and formats, and finalizing clear, user-friendly instructions to guide participants in data entry.
- Data Dictionary Development: The Data Dictionary, which will provide additional guidance on metadata standards and usage, is currently in progress. The working group has been working on developing more robust usage guidelines, as well as identifying resources and tracking FAQs for inclusion in the Digital Repositories Guide.

- Bulk Ingest Documentation (Bulkrax Importer): The Database Best Practices
 Documentation Team successfully completed a tutorial guide for using the Bulkrax
 Importer to support bulk ingest workflows.
- Workform Test Site: A test site for the finalized workform has been created, based on the preliminary version submitted by DAWG.

Institutional Repository Working Group Highlights:

- Completed the ScholarWorks section of the <u>Digital Library Repository Guide</u>
- Reviewed enhancements and updates to the datasets form, presentation form, project form, abstract only works, and the new statistics dashboard.
- Made several suggestions for ScholarWorks functionality, including exploring the
 possibility of faculty/staff project form for materials that don't belong to any existing
 categories, adding the depositor agreement to the About Us page of the user-facing
 ScholarWorks site.
- Weighed in on broader digital repositories projects like the creation of a successful grants repository, and archiving print journals.
